This seminar runs Monday after lunch through Thursday after lunch. The registration fee includes 3-1/2 days of instruction, use of equipment (if needed), 3 nights of lodging, 9 meals, and insurance. The registration fee is \$275.00; \$50.00 is due with the registration form and the balance of \$225.00 is due the first day of class. No refund will be made after September 15.

Weaving instructor, **Ellen Dorosh from Cascade, Maryland**, has been weaving for over 20 years. She took her first formal weaving class in the fall of 1991 with Barbara Diefenderfer, Master Weaver, at the Washington County Museum of Art in Hagerstown, Maryland. Over the years, Ellen has attended various fiber conferences, studying with nationally- and internationally-known instructors. Ellen loves to share her knowledge and teaches both small groups and individuals. She is a member of Hagerstown Weavers Roundtable and Central Pennsylvania Guild of Handweavers and was Education Co-Chair of the Mid-Atlantic Fiber Association Workshop Weekend for 2007 and 2009.

Ellen will lead this “Double the Fun with Doubleweave” workshop for the novice weaver and beyond. During the workshop, students will wind a warp, dress the loom, and weave a doubleweave sampler. Students will then wind a second warp, dress the loom, and weave either a weaving tool holder or bag that may then be finished with a braid of Nawi Awapa, a Peruvian finger-weaving technique. A \$25.00 materials fee will be collected during class. **NOTE:** The camp owns 3 looms, but students are encouraged to bring their own or borrow a table or portable floor loom from a friend, if possible. This will allow taking an unfinished project home to finish and enjoy.

The class size will be kept small to allow individual attention as needed.
